IT'S OFFICIAL: BEDDINGTON CORNER EXISTS!

Back in June 2007 we ran a front page article highlighting the scandal of the name and post code lottery that Royal Mail saddled us with. They insist on calling the old village of Beddington Corner, which dates back hundreds of years, "Mitcham", even though we are not and never were part of Mitcham. The fact that it is in fact an abbreviation of "Mitcham Corner, which Royal Mail called their post office in London Road, because of the name of the nearest railway station, helps very little.



But success, after a fashion, has come at last, in black and white and metal. The new 20 mph road signs at the entrance of Orchard Avenue, New Road and Seymour Road, state clearly that you are now entering BEDDINGTON CORNER!

Back in the 1840's Beddington Corner was a sizeable village of 60 houses, mostly strung along the London Road, housing industrial workers at the mills on the Wandle. Hackbridge was a small hamlet half the size, housing farm labourers, clustered round the old Red Lion pub. Beddington Corner was given its present character when a local builder laid out the existing street grid in the 1890's. In the London A-Z atlas, that is just what it is called. The area of Beddington Corner is in fact easy to work out. If the post code is CR4, you are in Beddington Corner. If it is SM6, you are in Hackbridge.

Let's not allow Royal Mail to take away our character. If the Post Office won't pay any attention to us, at least we can reclaim our name and use as an address:

New/Wolsley/Spencer Roads etc,
Beddington Corner,
near Mitcham, CR4....

Let's not let Royal Mail rob us of our heritage!

Community COOKBOOK: Sylvia's famous Bread Pudding: makes about 12 squares *PLEASE BRING IN YOUR FAVOURITE RECIPES to Community Games Night, 8pm on Thursdays!*

1 lb / 500g cut stale loaves, at least two days old
(brown or white or a mixture)
4oz / 150g dried fruit – sultanas, currants etc
2-3 tsp mixed spice
2 eggs
Up to a pint of milk

Put the ingredients into a bowl, mix well and leave for at least an hour (preferably overnight).

Grease a dish about 8 inches / 20cm square, pour in the mixture and smooth down.

Bake for about 1½ -2 hours on Gas 2-3 / 150 deg C until golden and springy - lower the temperature if the pudding browns too quickly.

Cool a little before cutting into 12. Sprinkle with sugar and serve warm – maybe with custard

For sprinkling over after cooking:

2 tablespoons sugar – granulated or Demerara

DO YOU KNOW THIS MAN? SANTA CLAUS - the background

The legend of jolly old Santa Claus, or St Nick, began with a real person: St Nicholas who lived many centuries ago. Although he is one of the most popular saints honoured by Christians, very little is actually known about him. He lived during the 4th century in Lycia, a province on the southwest coast of Asia Minor. Tradition says he was born in Patara, a seaport, and travelled to Egypt and Palestine as a young man. Eventually he became bishop of the church at Myra. During the period of persecution of Christians by Emperor Diocletian, he was imprisoned, but he was released by Diocletian's successor, Constantine the Great.

The transformation of St Nicholas into Santa Claus, or Father Christmas, began in Germany among Protestant churches. There he was called Kriss Kringle, derived from Christkindle, meaning 'Christ Child', and he became permanently associated with the Christmas season and gift giving. From there his legend spread to France, where he was called 'Pere Noel'. In the Dutch colony of New Amsterdam (now New York City) he was called 'Sinter Claes', which easily became 'Santa Claus'.

As Christmas became more widely celebrated, the legend grew. In 1823, Clement C. Moore wrote 'A visit from Saint Nicholas', portraying Santa Claus riding on a sleigh drawn by 'eight tiny reindeer', the same mode of travel he uses in Scandinavia. The first drawing of him that resembles today's Santa Claus was a cartoon by Thomas Nast that appeared in Harper's Weekly in 1866.

VICAR'S CORNER

WHAT DOES CHRISTMAS MEAN TO YOU?

I recently went round five houses near the church to find out what Christmas means to people. Here are the responses:

"It means having the family round and giving love – and you can give presents as well. And putting the lights on the house and the Christmas tree."

"Happiness, sharing and family."

"Not a lot of difference to me. Remembrance Day means more. Sorry."

"Children, happiness, peace."

"It's a traditional Christian festival (my Dad is a Hindu), a celebration of the birth of Christ." The children added: "We get to open all the presents and we get lots of chocolate!"

It means the same for me too, a family time and a bit of a rest. But Christmas for me is also about another family – the worldwide family of Christians who live in the light of God's forgiveness and the hope of resurrection. The Christmas story of Jesus birth in poverty is God's way of "giving love". We believe that in the birth of Jesus, God got involved - that as a result of Jesus' life, death and resurrection we have a way of becoming part of that family.
