Gift Aid allows the charity to reclaim basic rate tax already paid on the donation from HM Revenue & Customs.

**Notes:**

You must pay an amount of income tax and or Capital Gains tax at least equal to the tax that the charity reclaims on your donations in the appropriate tax year. (i.e. 28p for each £1 you give up to April 5th 2008 & then 25p for each £1 you give on or after 6th April 2008).

You can cancel this declaration at any time by notifying the charity.

If in the future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax that the charity reclaims, you can cancel your declaration.

If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief in your Self Assessment tax return.
